 unto my said Executor Samuell Withersome Thre Shillings, And I desire and
 appoynt my loving friend Mr William Deane, and Mr Thomas Stagge
 to be Overseers of this my last Will and Testament unto whom I give Thre
 Shillings a peece, And revoking all former wille I declare this to bee my
 last Will and Testament, And I witness whereof I have given unto sub-
 scribed my name and putt to my seal the thre and twentieth day of March one
 thousand six hundred forty eight, Anno Althorpe h. r. marke, Sealed
 subscribed and delivered the day and year aforesaid in the presence of
 Mr John Dase h. r. marke, Anno Dawson h. r. marke, Edward Wynn.

 Gibbes my second sonne all that hee hath of myne in his occupation and to
 two younger warts and the two geldings only to acquitt him of a legacy of
 twenty pounde given to him by my Father Thomasson sonne by my mother
 gave my sonne Richard Thre pounde wch is Owning to Gibbes my sonne
 to pay him only I desire my sonne Richard to quit my sonne my sonne
 Owning to Gibbes of the said Thre pounde, Item I will and bequeath after
 my decease by my Executor Thre Shillings, Item I will and bequeath to my
 daughter Gardner Thre Shillings, And likewise to my daughter Thre Shillings
 Shillings, Item I will and bequeath to my daughter Thre Shillings
 to be paid unto her when they shall require the same of my Executor after
 my decease, Item I will and bequeath unto John Gibbes my wife the
 parte of land wch is Owning to Gibbes my wife if it fall to my said wife
 and after her decease unto my said Executor at his disposing for ever,

I have will and bequeath to my daughter Anna and my daughter Bridget and sister
 of them one tenth of my lands all ready put in and other of them of them and
 my young sister, I have appointed Richard Gibbes my Executor desiring to
 be my debt and my legacies performed, I have will unto my said wife and sister
 be furnished with some of the best linnen and stuffe, and all the residue my sonne
 Richard his heirs forever, I have will give unto all my tenants in the parish
 of North with certain lands to them belonging to have and his forever, I have
 will and bequeath unto Anna Gibbes two hundred pounds of good and lawfull
 money of England, And likewise unto my daughter Bridget Gibbes two hundred
 pounds of good and lawfull money of England which is to be paid unto them
 by my Executor the aforesaid Richard Gibbes and this is to be paid within a
 halfe year after my decease unto them, or else to pay the same unto them and
 likewise unto the Executor the content at Godmersham which is to be paid
 my Executor, Richard Gibbes. Roger Dore his marke, John May his
 marke.

 my body I will to the earth from whence it came to be buried in decent

 touching my worldly estate wherewith I have pleased God to bless me
 I give and dispose of the same in manner and form following, I reserve
 wherewith I am possessed of a tenor hold estate held from the Dean and Chapter
 of Saint Paul London, which is I shall please God I will it intend to
 surrender to and for the use of my Executor, for and towards the benefit
 of himselfe and the payment of such debts as I owe, and discharging the
 severall legacies by me herein given, And I desire that such who shall have
 power to do the same may and will be pleased to settle the same to my
 intent and meaning, That is to the use and behoofe of Emanuel Swetland
 and his heirs and assigns forever, my said Executor unto whom I give
 and bequeath all my right title and interest in the said estate lying in the
 manor of North in the County of Essex, I have will give to my loving friend
 Mr. John Allenson the sum of forty pounds, I have will give to
 the two children of Mr. William Gifford twenty pounds to be equally divided
 betwixt them, I have will give to Constant Terry my god daughter Ten
 pounds
