 paid as soon as conveniently can be after my decease
 by my Trustees and Executors hereinafter named also
 I order and direct that my said Trustees and Executors
 do and shall immediately or as soon after my decease as
 conveniently can be cause a full true and perfect
 Inventory Valuation and Appraisement to be taken
 and made of all and singular my Household Goods
 and Furniture together with all my Stock in Trade
 as of Groceries and every Article belonging thereto
 which shall in any way be considered my property
 and all and singular other my personal and
 Testamentary Estate of every kind situated lying
 and being in upon and about my dwelling house
 and premises in which I now or any other which I
 may occupy at the time of my decease calling to.

 or owing owing to me by any person or persons at
 the time of my decease in order that the whole of
 my personal Estate may be ascertained in Arrouney and I
 do give and bequeath to my loving wife Priscilla

 (and engaging to them my said Trustees and Executors
 to do all necessary repairs) for her sole use and
 benefit during the term of her natural life after
 which I do give the said farm equally unto and

 the same to be managed by them my said Trustees
 and Executors at their discretion during the minority
 of them my said sons (but should either of them my
 said sons die in their minority then I do give and bequeath
 their part or parts to be equally divided amongst all
 the surviving children which I shall leave by my
 my said wife Priscilla also I do further and direct that
 my said Trustees and Executors do please out Eight
 hundred pounds of my said personal Estate (and which
 I also give them in Trust for that purpose) at Interest
 either on Bond or Government Security in their joint
 names and shall and do pay and apply the Interest
 dividend and proceeds thereof from time to time as the
 same shall be due or come to their hands to the use
 of my said wife Priscilla during the term of her
 natural life and at her decease to dispose ~~of~~
 of it in manner following that is to say to pay my
 son James Peire Eighty five pounds to Sampson a
 like sum of Eighty five pounds and to William Dreding
 the sum also of Eighty five pounds and the remainder
 of the said sum of Eight hundred pounds I do give to be
 equally divided to and amongst my two daughters Priscilla
 and Jane with benefit of survivorship to them my sons
 and daughters respectively the same to be paid them
 as they ~~shall~~ attain severally to the age of twenty
 one years and my Will and will further is and
 upon further Trust I do order and direct that they my
 said Trustees and Executors shall and do at their
 discretion so employ and manage all the rest and
 residue of my said personal Estate as they shall think
 proper and most advantageous to and for them my said
 children and that they my said Trustees and Executors
 do pay and apply the Interest profits and proceeds
 thereof to the sole use of maintaining and educating
 all them my said children during their minority or
 minorities and my Will and will further is and I do
 order and direct my said Trustees and Executors to pay
 and to divide all this last mentioned part of my

said personal Estate is used and applied as hereunto before
 directed equally unto and amongst all them my

 entrusted or deposited by virtue of or under the Trust hereby
 created and in them imposed nor the act of them my said
 Trustees and Executors for the other or others of them or
 for the acts deeds Receipts or payments of the other or
 others of them but each for himself only and for his
 own acts deeds Receipts and payments and no more and
 I do hereby make nominate constitute and appoint my
 Father in Law William Peirce of Dover aforesaid a
 Gentleman and Mr Benjamin Warden of Dover aforesaid
 the said County of Kent my Executors and my said wife
 Priscilla my Executrix jointly at this my last Will and
 Testament and I do request them to see the same and the
 Trusts thereof duly put into execution and performed
 and I do hereby revoke and make void all former and
 other Wills by me at any time heretofore made In
 witness whereof I the said Sampson Peirce the Testator
 have to this my last Will and Testament contained in
 three sheets of paper to the first two sheets thereof
 set my Hand and to the third and last my Hand and
 Seal the day and year first above written. Sampson Peirce

I Sampson Peirce do make this as a Codicil
 which I do fix to my last will and Testament bearing date
 twenty seventh day of May in the year one thousand eight
 hundred and three and design it to be taken as a part thereof

That is to say that over and above the sum of Eight hundred
 pounds which I have given to my beloved wife Priscilla do
 direct them my said Trustees and Executors to bear out
 and which I also give in Trust for that purpose a further
 sum of four hundred pounds to be in like manner appraised
 to her my said wife and at her death to be equally divided
 amongst my said children And whereas I have given all the
 rest of my personal Estate to them my said children I
 do give one sixth part of the same to her my said wife
 during the time of her widowhood or otherwise that is if
 she marries I do give the same sixth part to be equally
 divided to and amongst them my said children signed and
 sealed the day and year above ^{as witness my hand} written
 William Aggleston, William Cook, Joseph Still, /s/

This Will was proved at London with a Codicil the twenty
 fifth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and three before the Right Honourable
 Sir William Rogers Doctor of Laws Argitor Sineper or
 Commissioner of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully
 constituted by the Oath of William Pearce Benjamin
 Aratten and Priscilla Pearce widow the Ancestor of the
 deceased and the Executors named in the said Will to
 whom administration of all and singular the Goods Chattels
 and Credits of the said deceased was granted the having
 been first sworn by Commission duly to administer /s/

 the sum of five pounds apiece I also give to Elizabeth
 the sum of five pounds of the said Parish of Calgarth
 and I also give and bequeath unto my servant
 the sum of two pounds and I also give and bequeath
 unto my servant David Ann Jones the like sum of five
 pounds all which remainory legacies I order and direct
 to be paid by my Executrix hereafter named at the
